What is the PTAC?

 The Physician-Focused Payment Model Technical Advisory Committee (PTAC) was created under the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 (MACRA)

What is MACRA?

- Bipartisan legislation enacted in 2015
 - Repealed the Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) Formula
 - Changed how Medicare rewards clinicians for value over volume
 - Created the Merit-Based Incentive Payments System (MIPS) that streamlines three Medicare payment programs
 - Created the PTAC

What are physician-focused payment models?

- As defined in the MACRA Final Rule, released October 14, 2016, a physician-focused payment model is an Alternative Payment Model:
 - (1) In which Medicare is a payer;
 - (2) In which eligible clinicians that are eligible professionals as defined in section 1848(k)(3)(B) of the Act are participants and play a core role in implementing the APM's payment methodology, and
 - (3) Which targets the quality and costs of services that eligible professionals participating in the Alternative Payment Model provide, order, or can significantly influence.

PTAC Composition

- Eleven members appointed by the GAO
 - Members have national recognition for their expertise in physician-focused payment models and delivery of care
 - No more than five are providers or representatives of providers

PTAC Purpose

- To provide comments and recommendations to the Secretary of Health & Human Services (HHS) on stakeholder-submitted physician-focused payment models using criteria established by the Secretary
- Secretary Burwell established her criteria for Physician-Focused Payment Models in the October 14, 2016 release of the MACRA final rule

PFPM Criteria

- The Secretary seeks PFPMs that:
 - 1) Incentives: Pay for higher-value care.
 - Care delivery improvements: Promote better care coordination, protect patient safety, and encourage patient engagement.
 - 3) Information Enhancements: Improving the availability of information to guide decision-making.

PTAC Priorities

- Preparation for proposal submissions on December 1, 2016
- Public data availability
- Finalizing analysis plan and scoring methodologies

Criteria for Evaluating Models

- Scope of proposed payment model (high priority)
- Promoting quality and value (high priority)
- Flexibility for practitioners
- Payment methodology (high priority)
- Evaluation goals
- Integration and care coordination
- Patient choice
- Patient safety
- Health information technology

Secretarial Response

 By statute, the Secretary of HHS must review the comments and recommendations of the PTAC and post a detailed response on the website of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)

Stakeholder Model Submissions


- Submissions will be accepted on an ongoing basis
- Letters of Intent must be submitted at least 30 days prior to full proposals
 - May be submitted as of October 1, 2016
- Full proposals may be submitted after December 1, 2016

Principles Guiding Request for Submissions

The PTAC is attempting to balance several principles in its request for model submissions:

- Giving succinct instructions.
- Providing ample information so the submission is complete.
- Making submission easy.
- Requesting sufficient details from submitters.
- Facilitating efficient evaluation.


Overall Proposal Submission Timeline



What Takes 16 Weeks?




Proposal Review and Recommendation Process
